First, these children lived in a small village and their unchurched parents were highly skeptical about allowing their children to come to a Christian camp. Secondly, these families were poor and unable to pay the camp fees.

And with the help of Grain of Wheat, along with contributions from the local town hall, all of the kids were able to come to camp where they heard the Gospel and now want to live for Jesus!
