


I was just 10 years old, when Jesus became my personal Savior and from that time on, I was very eager to share Jesus with my family and friends.

By age 13, I started an after-school children Bible club with the help of 2 friends along with my brothers and sister. We held it for a week in the summer and a week in autumn. We even set up the program which included games, Bible stories and Christian songs.

As I grew into adulthood, God personally trained me and brought others into my life who discipled me in communicating the Good News of Salvation effectively. I was given many opportunities to do this at clubs, camps and youth groups in Switzerland, Belgium, England, USA and beyond.

But at age 20, when I was studying God's Word abroad and seeking a deeper relationship with Him, He asked me this life-defining question: "Who is going to lead your life?" I wanted to answer, "I'll lead my life with Your help." Yet, I knew deep down that this was

not possible. It was either God leading, or me. He was giving me the freedom to make this choice for myself and I wholeheartedly responded:

"My will is that YOU lead me ... You do what You want with my life. It is my will that YOU are my LORD. Send me where You choose, (but if possible, not to a country, with snakes, for I hate them!)"

This decision took my life in a direction that has been unexpectedly full of deep meaning and purpose. Even though my journey has not always been easy, and ministry is often very tiring, I've been embraced by the love of God and the support of my Godly husband and 4 lovely children, every step of the way.

After all these years of working in Bible clubs, kid's camps and youth groups, God was now prompting me to disciple young adults, by passing my expertise on to them through training seminars. I told the Lord that I was not the right person for this job,

as I knew the "how to", but not the theory. In spite of how I felt about this, God had a plan for me and used my husband to **push** me to teach.

Very timidly, I taught a few courses. I soon realized that the students liked what they were learning, and I found great joy in teaching them. Through this, I met other experienced and knowledgeable trainers whose insights were different than mine, but very complementary.



Twenty-five years and 10 countries later, I am filled with inexpressible joy, that God has chosen me to disciple the next generation by sharing, teaching and training them how to minister better than me!

All because of that defining moment so long ago when I responded to God's question, "It is my will that YOU are my LORD, that YOU lead me, that YOU do what You want with my life."

God calls, God pushes, God encourages!

HIS LAST COMMANDMENT IS OUR FIRST CALLING!

When someone is leaving their loved ones, their last instructions are usually given at the end of their stay. Similarly, our Lord Jesus, at His final meeting with the apostles, passed "the baton" on to them with His last instructions of The Great Commission. Moreover, He provided them with eternal guidelines for His Kingdom, which were not limited to them, but also for coming generations.

As Jesus' followers in this generation, what does it look like to be an authentic disciple and how do we apply His calling to make disciples of all nations?

In the OT, prophets were called by God at a particular time, for a specific mission. In the NT, God's calling has a more distinct meaning that is almost synonymous with salvation. In this context, calling is overwhelmingly, God calling the whole of humanity to Himself through His Only Son. Jesus' Calling is:

١.

Personal

Jesus clearly outlined the purpose of His calling. In Greek, "called" means to be invited or to receive an invitation. Christ invited the disciples to "follow" Him first, then become "fishers of men". You can't make a disciple if you are not a disciple.

2.

Consistent

Jesus' calling has been always full of love, kindness and surely thoughtful. Did Jesus say, "If someone wants to follow Me, then let him follow Me" and that's it? No, He didn't stop there! Jesus' calling isn't confined to a one-time event in our life. Follow Me is for our entire life! It is not only at Sunday school or youth meetings, summer camps or church seminars, mission trips or seminary conferences.

Since Jesus is totally unique in His approach toward His followers, He asks us to follow Him unreservedly at home, school, university, the workplace and church for a lifetime!



3. Always & Everywhere

When Jesus, our Master, calls us to follow Him, He isn't asking us to follow when it's convenient for us. He expects us to respond when we hear His voice calling our name.

As we walk with Jesus, we're in the presence of a God who is utterly supreme over any other. As our Master, He has the right to expect our prompt response to His call and leave our *filled fishing nets* behind to follow Him. Otherwise, it's impossible for us to become His authentic disciples. Why? The reason is simple and obvious:

If we are not willing to answer His call and follow Him now, we are not recognizing His sovereignty over us as our One and Only LORD.

As we enter this new decade, it is vital to understand that Christianity without discipleship is Christianity without Christ.

So, let us live this unchanging restorative truth in the midst of our chaotic wounded world, knowing that it's His calling to discipleship that empowers us.

Thus, we will continue until our last breath, to be committed disciples whose sole life's purpose is to make disciples. As we lead broken children and youth into a life transforming relationship with Jesus, we are making them disciples. By bringing separated families together and restoration to hopeless communities in the name of Jesus, we open the door to making disciples.

Today, it is our calling and privilege as disciples, to fulfill Jesus' last instructions by following in His footsteps, with the companionship of The Holy Spirit and the Omnipresent Love of our Abba Father.
